What is a simulation and why would you be interested?

Simulation: (sĭm'yə-lā'shuhn)

Simulations are fictional scenarios where students participate in life-changing events. Simulations allow for and inspire student initiative and ownership in such a way that the student is empowered beyond their current capability. The student is the driver and a real love of learning can be expressed and often increases through application.

Why:

- Have fun and learn a lot about yourself in the process
- Experience immediate personal change
- Accidentally learn a surprising amount
- Learn from your mistakes without the consequences
- Meet new people and create awesome memories

Who & When:

Youth: age 11-15
Young adult: age 15-18
College/Adult

Where:

Live-online: At your house (*anywhere with high-speed internet*)
4 Locations in Northern Utah (*see website for details*)

Cost:

\$140 for 4 months of 4 simulations (*\$35 per event or \$420 yearly for your convenience*)

Summary:

Empathize with history as you meet with and temporarily become the great authors of all time. Immerse yourself in the world of writing, come discuss and write about substantive subject matter. How do simulations work?

1. Apply and get accepted into P.A.C.T. Simulations
Each participant is screened for safety and desire
2. Receive the first simulation's preparation packet including
Scenario background sketch
Role introduction
Letter of invitation from notable individual within the scenario
3. Collaborate with same-role participants for several weeks
4. Engage with other role participants
5. Participate in the event
6. Participate in the debrief
7. Write up personal your experience

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
