### **1. Rabbit Habit** (*Personal Leadership*)

Purpose: To dig down into the essence of the Covey and Householder principles. Join in a student-to-student dialogue regarding context and application of the two approaches.

In your medical profession you have never been asked to play such a wild and different role, but as you opened the letter it all became clear. The fate of one man's existence lies in your hands, a challenging event with nothing less than a fatal result either way.

### **2. The China Dilemma** (*U.S. Geography*)

Purpose: To learn current and past US Geography. Engage in a dialogue with youth and naturally have fun using and testing your geography skills.

You have been asked to participate on a specially designed board given critical responsibilities. You must use your extraordinary skills in geography in behalf of millions. More on your assignment to come...

### **3. The Menu Crisis** (*Cooking*)

Purpose: Expand your cooking skills, your confidence and your scope of international cooking possibilities.

As one of the top international chefs, you have been called on for what could be one of the most impactful projects of your life and career. The fate of nations could be in your capable hands.

### **4. Time Machine** (*History*)

Purpose: Have fun preparing for an event where you will discuss history with students your age. Take the first steps to falling in love with history.

You have been called in to the Oval Office having been told very little about the reasons, only that you will be collaborating with other world-renowned historians. This is a top-secret meeting of epic importance.

### **5. The Logical Choice** (*Logic*)

Purpose: To learn the purpose and substance of logic in a fun environment of application. To value the "logic tool" and take the 1st steps that will eventually effect comprehension, writing, speaking, persuasion, debunking (propaganda, media, politics, etc.), test taking, thinking and sales.

Purpose: To learn & practice the “Ronald Reagan skill” of diplomacy. So that eventually you can pull the “...tear down this wall” card out of your pocket and use it when needed. To put the public school system and subjects of study (such as math) in their right context--students are in charge.

Join a team that has been long needed. Be part of the initial group responsible for changing education in America and the rest of the world. The revolution can start with you. Warning this will be a worthy challenge and is not for the faint of heart.

**8. “Word Mania” vs. Oswald** (*Etymology*)

Purpose: To introduce etymology in a fun setting.

Many of the participants in a recent game-show have been summoned to court in the attempt to prove whether or not Mr. Oswald is guilty regarding an extraordinary offense involving etymology.

**9. The Commission** (*Politics and Statesmanship*)

Purpose: To better comprehend the immigration issue and the likely solutions. To practice statesmanship skills before, during and after the event.

A special and uniquely constituted commission has been called together by President Obama to discuss and make decisions regarding the immigration problem in the US.

**10. Dead author’s society** (*Writing, History and Philosophy*)

Purpose: Open eyes to great authors and their personalities. Take some first steps on the long road to writing like the greats.

Emphasize with history as you meet with and temporarily become the great authors of all time. Immerse yourself in the world of writing, come discuss and write about substantive subject matter. It will be a unique and life-changing opportunity to witness personalities interact, who were separated by nearly two and one-half millennia.

**11. In Living Color:** (*Writing, Current Events and Philosophy*)

Purpose: Open eyes to today’s authors and their personalities. Take some first steps on the long road to better writing. Eventually be prepared to connect and collaborate with them.

Become a well-known author of today and try your hand at representing their perspective in a powerful scenario. Push yourself beyond your ability as you grapple with some of themes of today.

### **12. Woman to woman** (*Womanhood and history*)

Purpose: A mother daughter event designed to convey true womanhood to the coming generations.

Over the last one hundred and fifty years the fight for women's suffrage has been waged and for the most part is has been won. Women may now vote, acquire education, own property, work where they choose, and lead! As women, have we come as far in our "liberation" as we want to go? In a culture were femininity is defined as a woman's "sex appeal" what aspects are we currently lacking?

What a great opportunity for you and your daughter to rediscover and redefine "Womanhood". You'll play the role of great and influential woman throughout history, past and present. Never before have Abigail Adams, Susan B. Anthony, Eleanor Roosevelt, Oprah Winfrey and others, been in the same room taking on the topic of nature and roll of women in our society.

### **13. Gibbon's v Ogden** (*Mock-court, history*)

Purpose: Introduce the history and some of the foundation of the courts and history behind American law.

Interact with "Chief Justice Marshall" as the case of "Gibbons v. Ogden" is resurrected as a simple ruling alters the course of history. Our Federal Government is, today, very engaged in our lives; this simulation will help you understand when federal intervention is valuable and provide a perspective for future understanding. Where does the government have the right and duty to interfere with the affairs of the people? What is the jurisdiction of the highest court in the land? Where do the states draw the line limiting federal intervention, and how do they do it? You will ponder these questions as you experience one of the greatest Supreme Court cases of all time.

### **14. Arizona v Dr. Jekyll** (*Society, court-room and self-control*)

Purpose: Bring a big problem in society into view and tackle some additional themes from the book the strange case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.

Substance abuse laws address growing needs as society manipulates chemicals and biological process to solve personal problems both in and beyond physical health. Much of the consequential suffering is dealt with in the courtroom. Participants will feel the weight and responsibility as they take people's lives into their own hands. The results of this fictional case could reveal solutions for a country weighed down with illegal and prescription drug problems. As a participant you will feel the magic of the courtroom and the pressure that comes with it.

### **15. Arizona v The Virginian** (*Ethics, law and character*)

Not only will you experience the courtroom, but tackle a case based in great western literature. When is it right to kill? Who should do it? What do the laws say? This case

deals with murder, natural rights and jurisdiction. Whether at the bench, on the jury or as a lawyer, this case can make a difference in your education long term. Participants will be introduced to all related scenario themes gradually as they work through the preparation materials.
